- No-bleed pastel Bible highlighters (recommended: AlohaStar HPSIZEE on Amazon. Regular highlighters will bleed through the thin pages of a Bible.)
- Your own copy of *How to Read the Bible for All it's Worth, 4th ed.* (ISBN-10 : 9780310517825 on Amazon)
- 5 thin dry erase markers for LA
- 4 pack of colored highlighters for LA
- Small pack of markers
- 1 pack of colored notecards for LA
- 1 4-pack of standard size sticky notes for LA

(A graphing calculator [TI 83+, TI-84+, TI-83+/84+ Silver Editions] will be required in Algebra 2 and higher math classes, as well as some science classes, and your math teacher may recommend it even for Algebra 1 or Geometry, so you may wish to buy that now. But if you are in a more basic math class and wish to wait until later to buy a graphing calculator, a simple scientific calculator, such as a TI-30a or TI-36xPro, will suffice. The calculator on your phone will not suffice.)
